All teaching staff, in collaboration with their supervisor, have developed a Performance Development Plan containing goals, professional learning that will be undertaken and evidence to show achievement of the goals. The plan is reviewed by the teacher half way through the cycle and by the teacher and the supervisor at the end of the year.
