Stage 1 History Excursion to Vacluse House

In HSIE this term, Stage 1 is studying a unit of work called *The Past In The Present*. Stage 1 students will be going on an excursion to Vacluse House on Monday 27 June or Tuesday 28 June (Week 10, Term 2). They will learn about what it was like to live at Vacluse House in the 19th century for both the wealthy Wentworth family and their many servants. They will discover how the Wentworths' 40 servants ran the household without the help of plumbing, power or electrical appliances. They will explore the house and gardens, play traditional games and find out what children wore in the 19th century.

Please note that the cost of the excursion is \$22 and a note was sent home this week.
