#### Learner Qualities

This week we introduced the fourth of our learner qualities: Critical and Creative Thinking.



#### **Critical and Creative Thinking**

Is thinking deeply and exploring new ideas.

This means that I ask questions, make connections and look at things in different ways.

As per the Australian Curriculum, students develop capability in critical and creative thinking as they learn to generate and evaluate knowledge, clarify concepts and ideas, seek possibilities, consider alternatives and solve problems. Critical and creative thinking involves students thinking broadly and deeply using skills, behaviours and dispositions such as reason, logic, resourcefulness, imagination and innovation in all learning areas at school and in their lives beyond school.

Critical and creative thinking is an important skill-set for developing student's ability and confidence to learn and later work in new or changing circumstances.

Next week your child will receive a 2021 Enrolment Confirmation note (on peach coloured paper). Completion of this promptly assists us with planning for next year. We would appreciate it if you could complete the form and return it to your child's mentor teacher as soon as possible but no later than Monday 2 November 2020. Thank you.

What Has Stage 1 Been Learning About? This week Year 2 students began their investigations into weather. They explored the Australian Bureau of Meteorology website and analysed a seven day weather forecast. Students gathered information about the weather by interpreting symbols, graphs and other data displays. It looks like we may have budding meterologists in the group!

#### **Police Liason Visit**

On Friday 25 September 2020 the Police Liasion Officers visited students in Stage 2 and 3 to discuss safety both in the community and safety online. Students really enjoyed taking part in these sessions and asked great questions.

#### **Check-In Assessment**

The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor Year 3 and Year 5 student learning following the period of learning from home.

The Check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Year 3 students will participate in a new reading and numeracy check-in assessment on Monday 19 and Tuesday 20 October 2020.

Students are asked to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment.

#### Pick Up

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).
