How do muscles grow?

Researchers from the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Research Institute, University of New South Wales and NeuRA are looking for children aged 5-14 years to participate in a research study.

More information? research study.

Who can participate?

Children 5 to 14 years of age inclusive, including children who have cerebral palsy.

What does participation involve?

Participation involves visiting NeuRA (in Randwick) three times for 1-2 hours and having an MRI scan of the leg. Scans can be done after school, on weekends and in school holidays. MRI scans are painless, harmless, don't use radiation and don't cause discomfort.

Why participate?

You will contribute to research that will help scientists understand disordered muscle growth in children with cerebral palsy.

You will see, first-hand, scientific research being conducted at one of Australia's leading research institutes.

You will be given a small gift or a small cash reimbursement.
