

Some facts about childhood anxiety:

- Most anxiety is learned. Yes, you read that right—it's largely a set of learned habits. The good news is that, like any learned behaviour, these habits can be changed.
- Children can learn 'return-to-calm' skills that help them manage and overcome anxiety. Although these skills are not often taught, children equipped with these well-researched techniques can build resilience independently.
- Children can be taught to be the 'boss' of their anxiety. With each successful attempt at managing their emotions, they become emotionally stronger and better equipped to handle anxious moments.
- If left unaddressed, a child's anxiety typically worsens over time. Early intervention is key to preventing the escalation of anxiety.
- Mentors, teachers, and parents play crucial roles in fostering children's emotional wellbeing. Changing the course of childhood anxiety is often simpler than we think.
