### NAPLAN 2024 Parent And Carer Information Each year the National



Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is undertaken by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2024 will take place over the next two weeks commencing with the Writing Assessment on Wednesday. Catch up Assessments will take place between Tuesday 19 March and Thursday 28 March for students who were absent on testing days.

Students in Years 3 or 5 who would normally attend extra-curricular activities such as music tutorials or band during these times will be required to complete the NAPLAN Assessments instead.

Students completing the NAPLAN assessments are required to bring their own headphones (with a 3.5mm headphone jack).
