






What's Been Happening With Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction

Counting and Representing Numbers to 10 This week in SB the students have been exploring ways to count and represent numbers to 10 using a ten frame. Ten frames are a visual resource that support students understanding the part-whole relationship of numbers to 10. The learners in SB have been practising and discussing how they can recognise different number combinations represented in a ten frame through a series of dot talks. This supports learners to build their subitising skills (ability to automatically recognise numbers in small collections) and their partwhole understandings, for example three dots and two more dots is five. Students have also been practising different ways they can represent numbers with words, numerals and fingers. Congratulations on your great learning SB!

From Protector to Coach: Supporting Children Through Anxiety

As part of The Anxiety Project, we are learning that while it's natural to want to protect our children from discomfort, constantly rescuing them from anxious situations can unintentionally reinforce helplessness. Instead, by shifting from "protector" to "coach," parents can help children build resilience and confidence.

Psychologist Michael Hawton explains that children thrive when they are supported with:

- Warmth: emotional safety and acceptance
- Boundaries: clear, consistent expectations
- Stretch: gentle challenges that promote growth

What Can Parents Do?

1. Identify unhelpful patterns: such as constant reassurance, avoiding situations, or speaking for your child.

- Start small: reduce one accommodation gradually (e.g., delaying your response to reassuranceseeking).
- 3. Expect resistance: initial pushback is normal and temporary.
- 4. Stay calm and confident: support your child without giving in to anxious behaviours.
- 5. Celebrate brave steps: acknowledge and reward progress toward independence.

The goal isn't to eliminate anxiety, but to help children develop the skills to manage it. As Hawton reminds us: "Anxious children don't need perfect parents – they need calm, confident ones."
